Slodge, what are you doing?



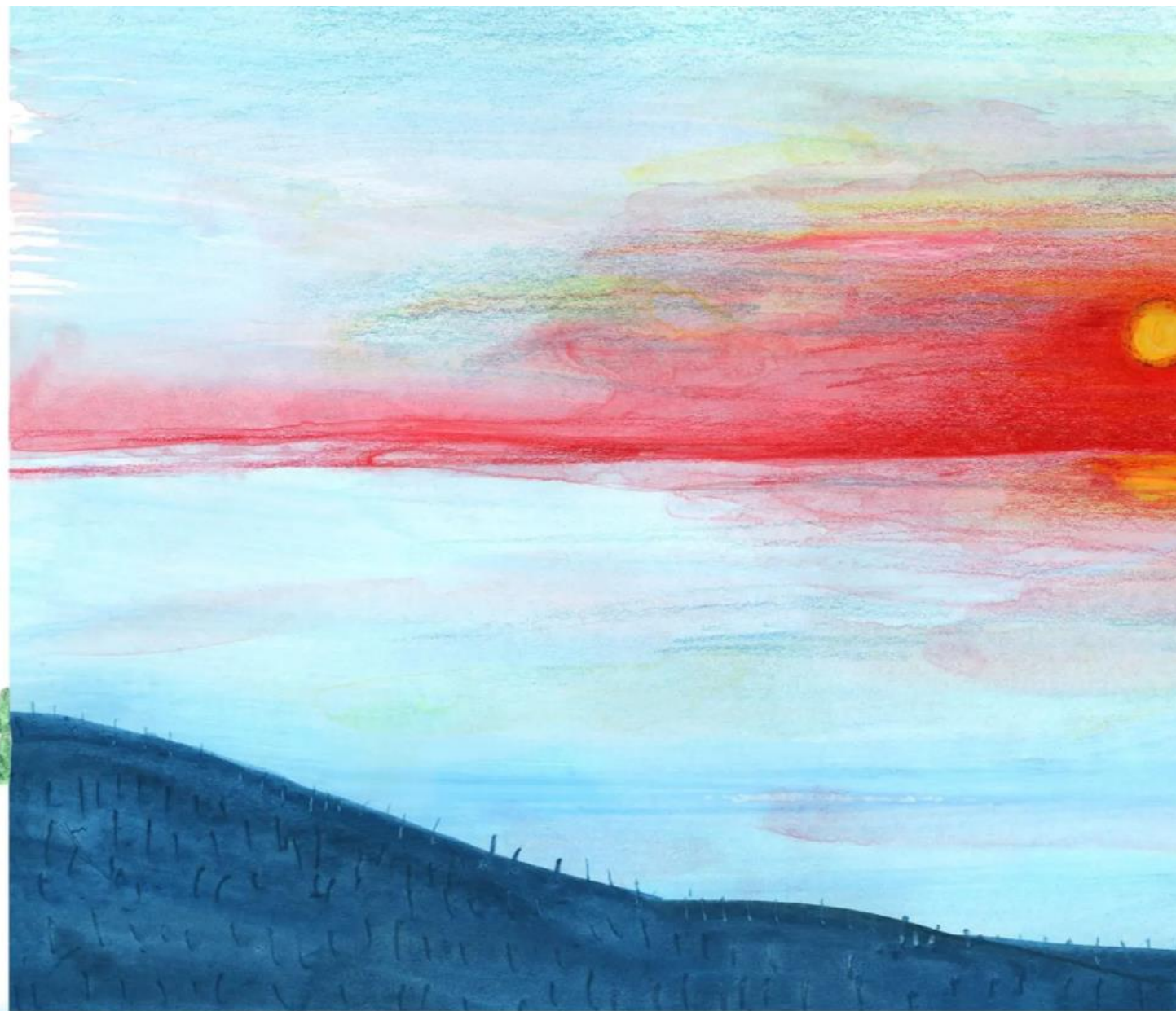
I am much

doing! Everyone is watching!

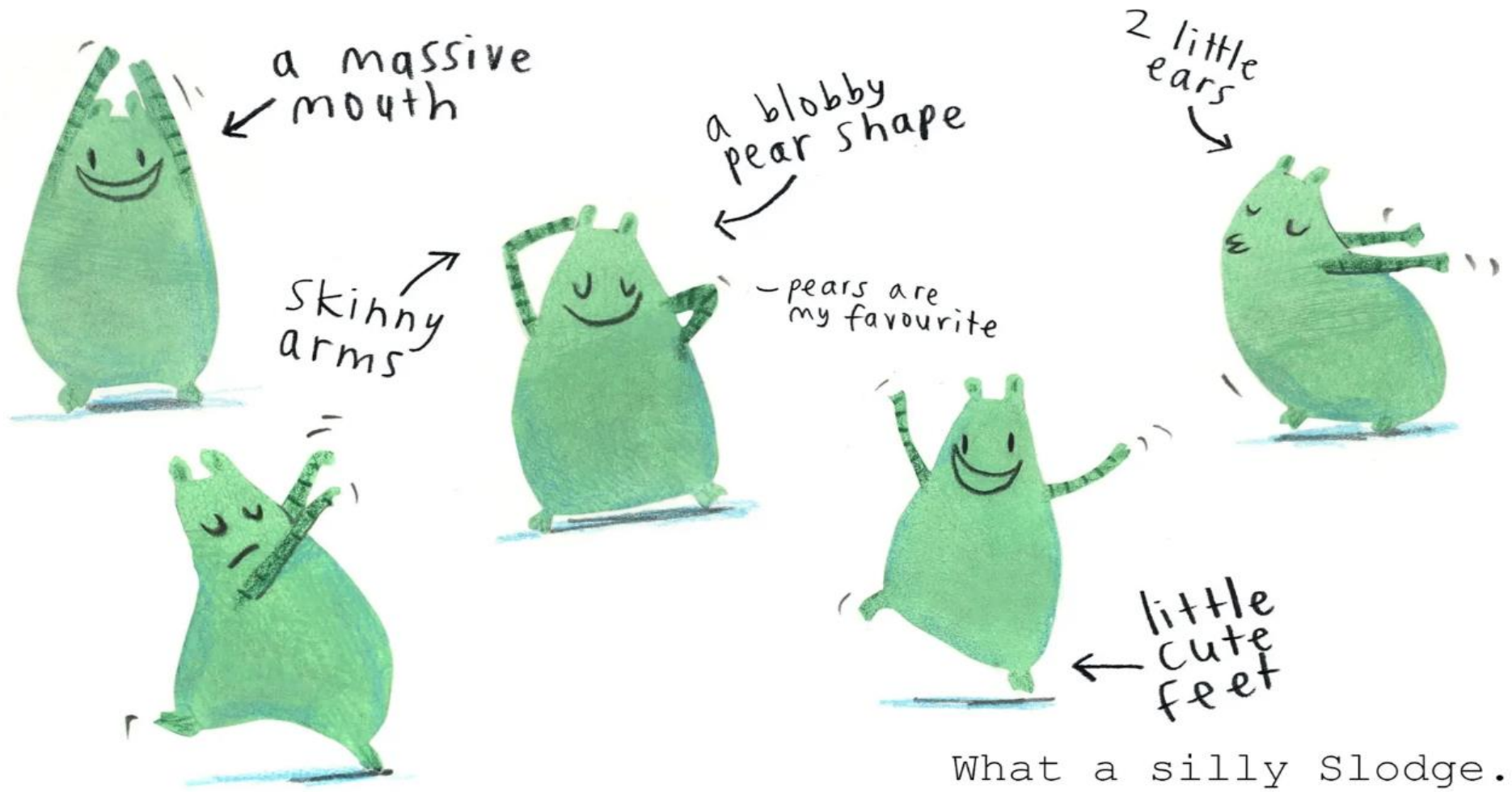
Ahh, here it is.



Slodge! NO!

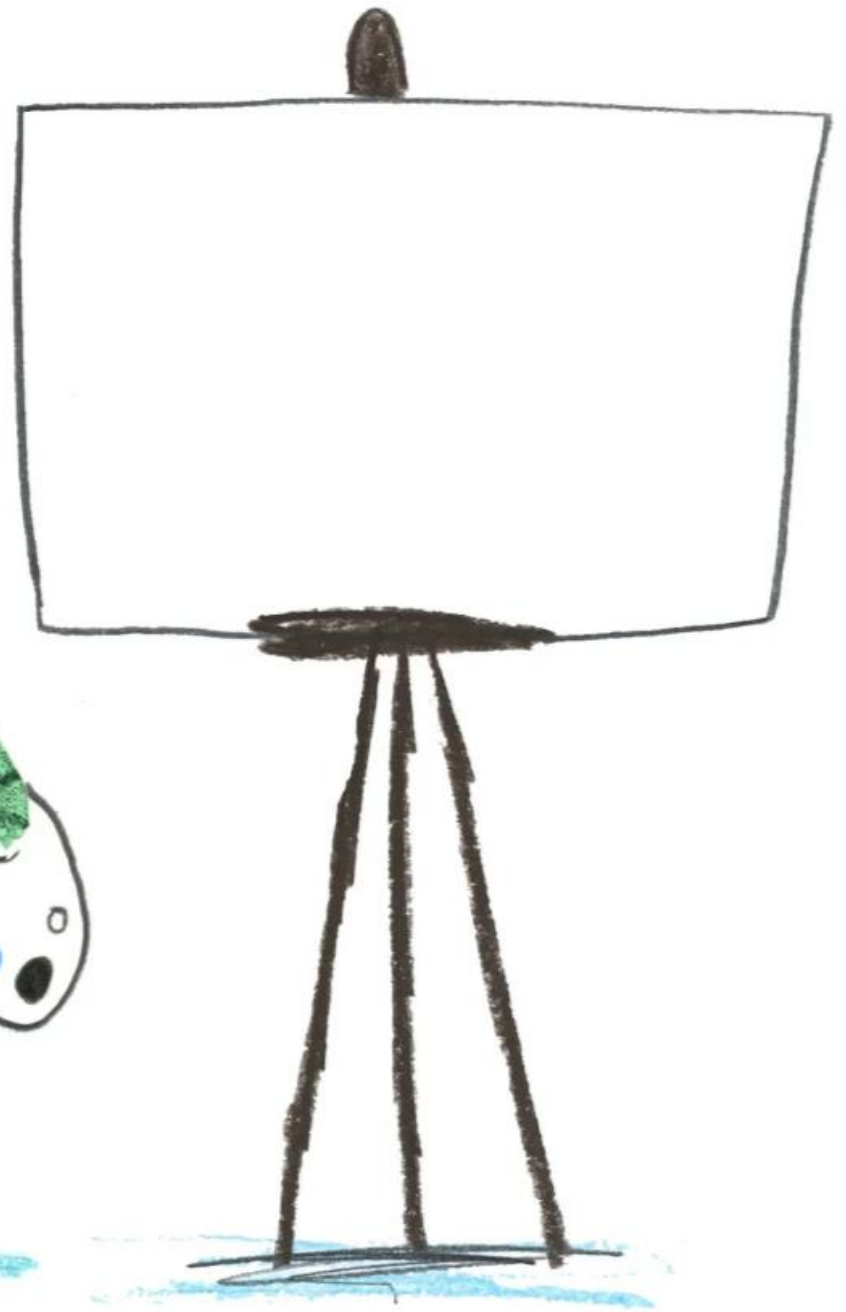


I am a Slodge. This is how you draw me!

painter

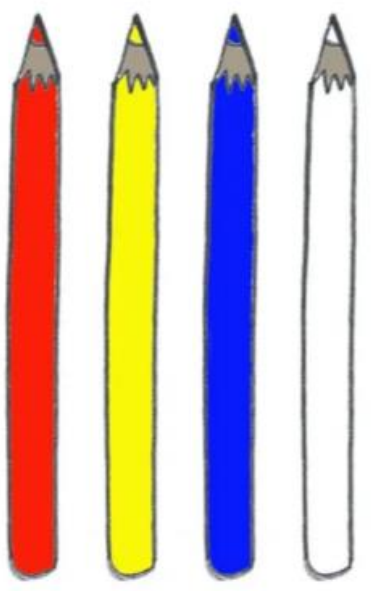
First, get all your art things.

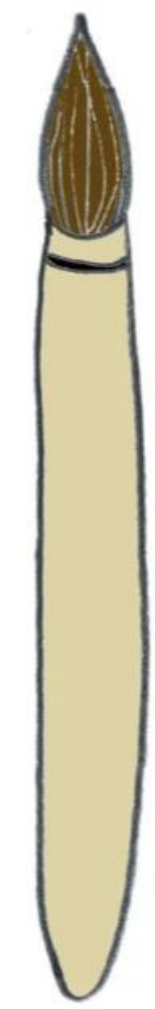

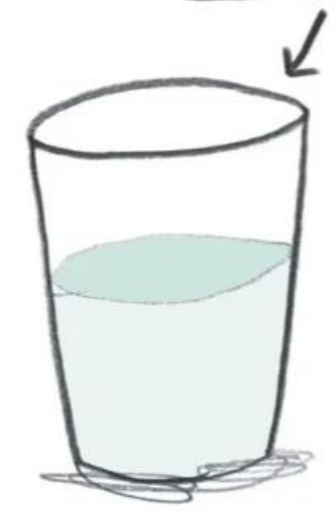

Then, paint a light blue wash
over the paper and wait for it to
dry. It's better if it's not
completely even, like this one.

mine's
still
wet...



use a hairdryer
if you get bored
waiting for it
to dry




Then, paint a little less than half
of the page with pink. Make the bottom
darker than the top. Dry it.



don't worry
if it's a bit
wobbly like
Jenni's one (shh)

Draw a light pencil circle
in the sky for the sun. Then,
paint more pink around it, making
the bottom darker than the top. Dry.



pink can be
made from
white paint
with a tiny
bit of red

Now paint more dark pink near
the sun. Paint some light pink on
the sea, mostly below the sun. Dry!



Paint the sun yellow, and go over the edges so that it looks like it's glowing. Paint a blurry oval reflection on the sea below, and paint two bright yellow streaks through it so that it looks like water. Dry.

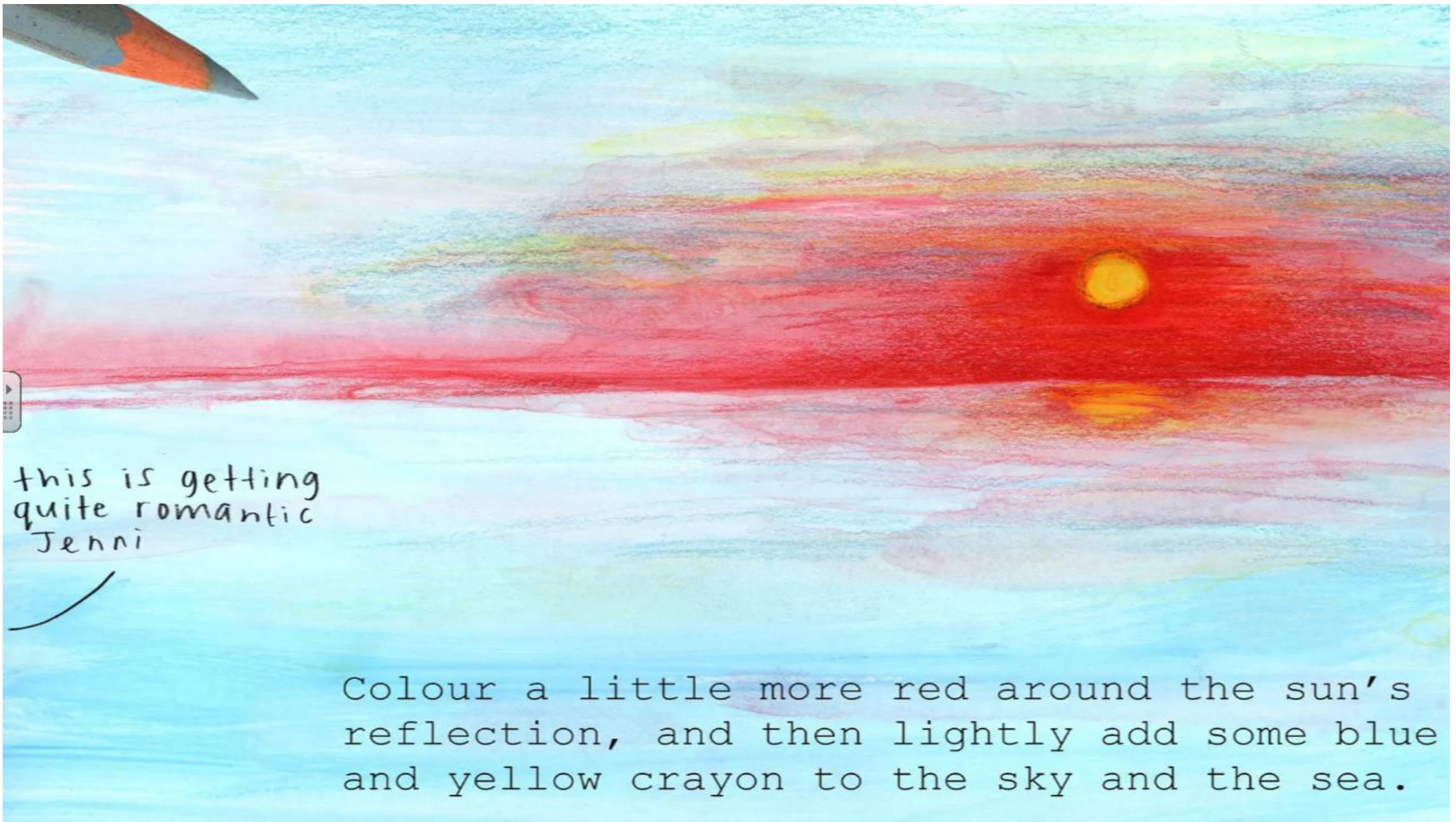


Using a red crayon, colour around the sun horizontally. Make sure you don't go over the sky into the water.



Sore
finger —

Keep colouring! Make the bits
around the sun and on the horizon
the darkest. Do a few red streaks
through the water and across
the sun's reflection with your crayon.

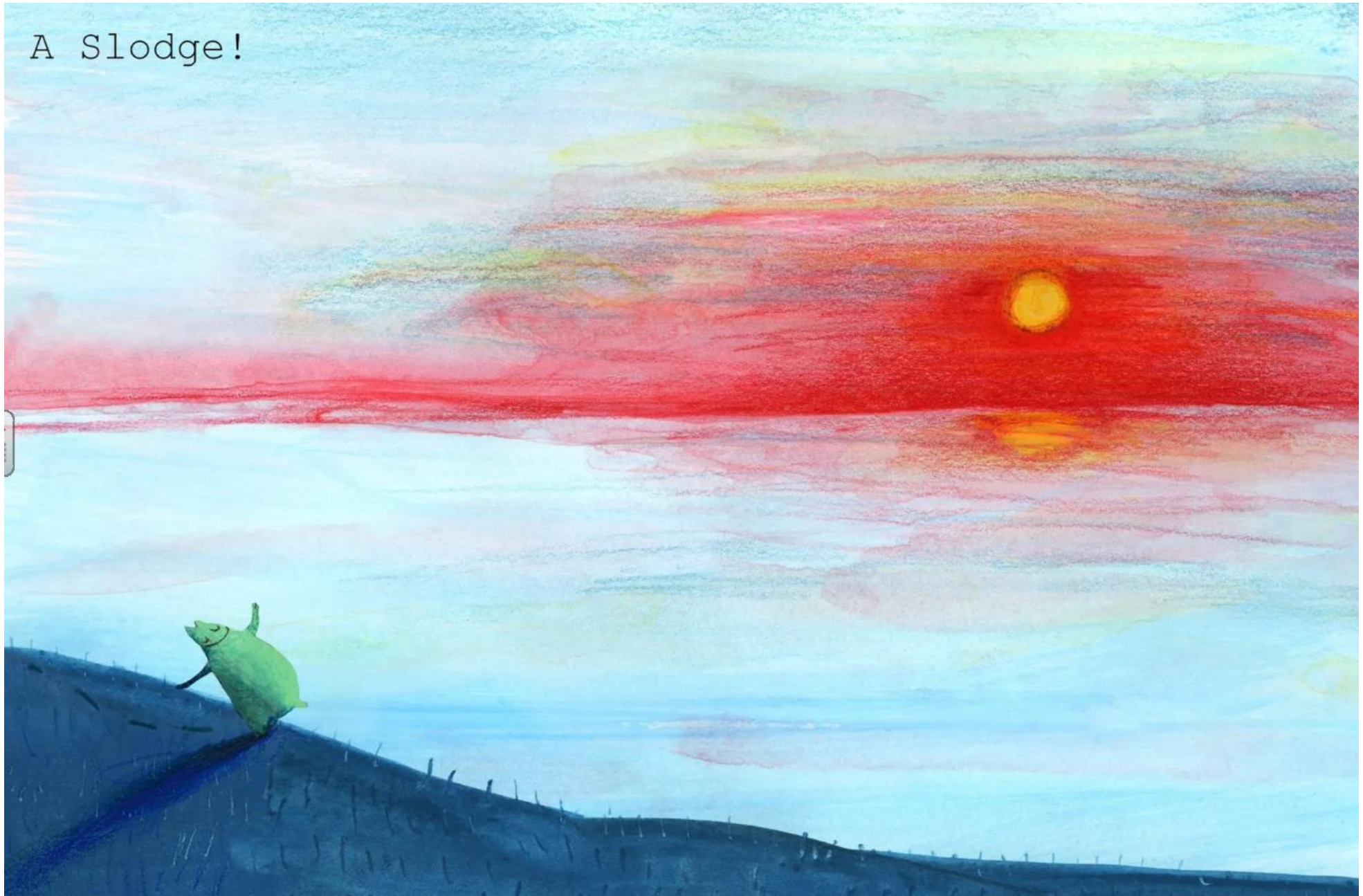
Colour a little more red around the sun's
reflection, and then lightly add some blue
and yellow crayon to the sky and the sea.

Mix blue paint with a tiny bit of black for the front hill.
When it's still wet, draw some grass with your blue crayon.



FINISHED! But it's

Now it's your turn !

- First try a sunset like splodge - using his colours
