



No Pedestrian Access—Please take note.....



We can see from our cameras that some parents are still walking down the wrong side of the drive. The pavement comes to an end half way down and the children then have to walk in the driveway before they can cross over to the other side.

Nuts Free

Zone

We have a number of children in school who have a severe allergy to nuts. We are taking this opportunity to ask/remind parents not to include anything containing nuts/nut products in their child's lunch box in order to prevent these children from **anaphylactic shock**.

Scooters/Bicycles

We would like to remind parents that their children must not ride their scooters or bicycles on school premises. They must dismount at the top of the drive and push them to the designated storage area. This is to prevent any accidents. Thank you for your cooperation.

Police Notice

In the road adjacent to our school we would like to remind parents about the need to park sensibly and not dangerously on bends, over dropped kerbs, complete dangerous manoeuvres or stopping on zigzags to allow children to disembark their vehicles causing great risk to them and others. PCSO's and Traffic Wardens will regularly patrol the area recording and photographing evidence, those caught will be issued with £90.00 fixed penalty notices. Parents should not be using the main driveway unless it is an emergency or prior arrangement has been sought—it is for staff only. There is also a speed limit of 5mph on the driveway.

IMPORTANT ATTENDANCE INFORMATION: Our school target is 97%. If appointments in school time cannot be avoided please ensure an appointment card (or letter) is handed to the school office prior to the appointment. If your child is absent through sickness please provide medical proof in the way of medication labels or prescription slip. Wherever possible attend school prior to appointments and return to school following the appointment. You should **not** keep your child off school for the whole morning, afternoon or all day. This applies to any kind of appointment. If your child does not return to school on the advice of a GP, always contact the school to inform them of the outcome.

ATTENDANCE NOTE TO PARENTS

If children are taken out of school during Term Time it is classed as unauthorised absence. If it extends to more than 10 days we can and will remove your child from roll. Attendance Services collect all absences and will take further action if necessary.

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EVERY SCHOOL DAY COUNTS -

Every single day a child is absent from school equates to a day of lost learning.

Attendance percentages can be misleading.

100% Attendance	0 Days Missed	Excellent
95% Attendance	9 Days of Absence 1 Week and 4 Days of Learning Missed	Satisfactory
90% Attendance	19 Days of Absence 3 Weeks and 4 Days of Learning Missed	Poor
85% Attendance	28 Days of Absence 5 Weeks and 3 Days of Learning Missed	Very Poor
80% Attendance	38 Days of Absence 7 Weeks and 3 Days of Learning Missed	Unacceptable
75% Attendance	46 Days of Absence 9 Weeks and 1 Day of Learning Missed	Unacceptable

For some parents, 90% may seem like an acceptable level of attendance, but the reality is that 90% attendance means that your child will miss half a school day each week or 19 days of school during the school year – that's nearly 4 school weeks.

Leave of Absence During Term Time

We **strongly recommend** that you check term dates with school - especially before you book a holiday.

You may get fined or even lose their school place if you take your children out of school during term time.

Schools can issue fines to parents who take their children out of school during term time.

Please think carefully before booking a holiday in term time. You should consider the potential

impact on your child's education.

Statistics show that 10 days' absence in any academic year means pupils' learning suffers and they do worse in tests and exams.

Remember that schools do not have to provide work for students taking holidays during term time.

Just a Friendly Reminder

We have a number of children arriving daily between 9.00am and 9.30am in the morning, some as late as 10.00am without good reason. The school day starts at 9.00am and children are allowed to enter their classrooms from 8.50am. It is very disruptive to the children who are already in school, on time and trying to work. It can also be quite distressing for the child who is late.

Attendance Services collect all absences and lates and will take further action if necessary. All reasons for absence should be reported to the school office before 9.00am.

If you think this applies to you and your children, can you please try and get them into school on time. Thank you.



After school clubs are running well, please remember to log on and cancel any clubs that your child will not be attending as another child might like to join in. The clubs run from 3.15pm to 4.15pm please be on time to collect your children at the end of the day. You can book your child onto these clubs by downloading the school gateway app. See instruction on how to do this on the school website. Thank you.



We are a GOREAD School. This app allows your children to search Bookshare by title, author, or ISBN or browse by the latest and most popular books. They can also access other libraries of content.

Basic features include the ability to search through the books and set bookmarks. There is also a summary page with information about the title. You can record your child's progress and the record will be kept for your child's entire reading school journey.

As parents, you can share information regarding tricky words and general comments to support home/school communication—If you have not already got the app go to the school website and follow the instructions.



School of Rock

On 3rd February, Children in year 6, 5 and 4 who play musical instruments had the opportunity to go to see School of Rock at the Alex theatre Birmingham. A wonderful time was had by all of the children who were extremely well behaved. Two of our children's views were 'The music was very loud and I loved the way they interacted with each other and how the children stood up to the parents and the Head Teacher — Ishkeerat and Giovarni said he loved the finale - the childs version

of School of Rock.

Year 3 have recently had chance to take part in a Stone Age workshop where they were introduced to what life was like for Stone Age people and handled a range of Stone Age tools and objects. They discussed how humans have evolved and then developed their hunting skills by hunting a woolly mammoth. They then talked about the skulls of Homo



Sapiens and Homo Neanderthalis and had great fun making tools using different materials and digging for artefacts, just like real archaeologists. They then completed some wonderful cave paintings before learning other hunting techniques such as archery.

STEM—Science, Technology. Engineering and mathematics

Years 4,5 and 6 took part in STEM workshops in January. They learnt about Rockets and Potions. Mutahara learnt about Gravity, Air Resistance, Force and Streamlined—'I liked the part when we built the rockets and tested to see how far they would go' Ishkeerat commented 'I learnt that when you turn liquid to solid it is not reversible except when using water
